# **Memory Garden**

Barbara Lipa was the Director of the Fairmount Library. She died in July 1979. In her honor a memory garden was created. Her daughter Missy and husband Rich (Collier) have volunteered

to take on the responsibility and expense for updating of the garden. This will involve clearing out the growth in the area, reducing the footprint of the garden and moving the stone with the memorial plaque closer to the flagpole. Once spring arrives the family will plant a portion of the garden with grass seed and plant flowers and perennials in the remaining area around the stone. They are asking no assistance from the library. I enthusiastically agreed to endorse the project.

## **Tech Packs**

The county and OCPL have provided Fairmount Library with four Chromebooks that patrons can check out from the library for three weeks. Each Chromebook kit comes with a wireless hotspot that has unlimited data (for use in the U.S. only), and the kits can be placed on hold. People who don't have broadband access at home can borrow it from the library. Lack of broadband access is a significant factor contributing to poverty in some areas.

## FINE POLICY FOR VETERANS AND ACTIVE MILITARY

Effective November 1<sup>st</sup> Central library and branches went fine free for veterans and active military with proper identification. Proper identification means a VA medical card, a drivers license with Veterans designation, or a military retiree identification card. This applies only to fines and not for lost or damaged items. Board approval is required to enact this program at Fairmount.
